TR: For the Access & Participation Plan we had a discussion with the OfS and the Access & Participation Team. They gave us three possible dates to submit. We aimed to submit it in July, and we wanted to change the category of registration for VAT exemption. If you are in the approved fee cap category you can be exempt from VAT. We thought we could submit it in October, but we were then told that submitting it then would result in an academic year delay. We had to apply as though we were a fresh college, even though we are already registered with the OfS. We worked really hard and submitted in July 2024. We need to submit our accounts and so we are working on that at the moment. The deadline is 15<sup>th</sup> December for the final signing off.

**UC:** The APP Plan is a chance to increase fees.

**TR:** And also, to provide bursaries and support for students. We have to give that undertaking.

**UC:** The benefit is based on the VAT.

**TR:** Also on the fees, which can be raised. Most universities charge over £9000 but we need to justify the facilities and supporting students. We can't afford to spend too much or too little as we have to ensure financial sustainability.

**IW:** Is there any understanding from the new government about changes.

**UC:** Nothing new at the moment.

**TR:** The change of government has meant changes were stopped for the present.

**IW:** In the school I am a governor for, then it has been impossible to get any details. That is in xxx which has a number of very small primary schools, which are barely viable.

**LS:** TR mentioned the funds to do other things. Does it make a difference if we have more students.

**TR:** Yes, of course, students generate income. The numbers are not declining but they are not increasing as much as we would like.
